**S**ignificant volumes of natural resources are illegally harvested and their proceeds laundered in the Asia-Pacific region, fostering corruption and undermining environmental governance. This conference will focus on ways to tackle illegal fishing and illegal logging in the region by the use of cooperative legal measures, particularly anti-money laundering and confiscation of proceeds techniques.

**P**resenters to **Following the Proceeds of Environmental Crime: Fish, Forests and Filthy Lucre** are coming from governmental, intergovernmental, academic and non-governmental institutions in Australia, the European Union, the Pacific Islands, Southeast Asia and the USA (30 persons). Participants from forests, fisheries and financial intelligence agencies in selected Asian and Pacific countries will be attending (50) in addition to invited Australian participants (20). Some additional self-nominated attendee places may be available. The conference will be followed by practical workshops exploring cooperative transnational measures.
